# Resident Corner: HCA Call Center Study Results

The call center for Healthcare Associates (HCA) receives approximately 1,000 patient phone messages every day. The way these messages flow through the practice impacts patient care, operational efficiency, and employee satisfaction.

A practice-wide survey to better understand current attitudes towards message management showed that almost 100% of staff members feel that managing phone messages is an important part of caring for our patients, but 30% report that messages don't always get to the right person the first time.

Interviews with nearly 40 patients and staff members revealed several areas that are working well: patients love that a person answers the phone and described how reassuring it is to talk to someone kind and patient. Staff appreciated the ability to connect directly with patients and residents, attendings, and NPs reported how much they appreciate the support of their colleagues.

We also found clear areas for improvement. Many roles feel overwhelmed by the number of messages they get, and the lack of transparency around the status of a task can lead to repeated, frustrated phone calls from patients. Our goal is to create a message management solution that is patient-centered with clear task tracking and ownership. The solution should prioritize teamwork and accurate message assignment as well as maximize patient engagement and make it easier for them to take ownership.

We had a robust discussion at Grand Rounds about potential solutions. The next round of residents will continue the work and move towards testing in the upcoming year. Thanks to everyone who contributed their time and support throughout this project!




# **Health & Wellness Tip from Ritika Parris**
